



FOR ORGANISED GROUPS

Days together.

A clearer way to stay connected.

Contact wristbands and attendance for school trips, clubs, outings and supported groups. One simple way to help a separated person reconnect with the adults responsible for their day.

A band. A card. A connection.

A finder scans the QR code to reach the event contact page. Friendly names make it clear who to call.

Organisers choose which registered members and helpers appear, and can change that list during the event.

Contact the group.

If someone is separated from the group, call a responsible adult below.

Discreet by design.

The band's QR code and reference do not, by themselves, identify the wearer, their organisation or their destination. Contact details appear only when someone scans the code or opens its link. Organisers can choose whether to print any additional identifying text on the band.



Set up once.

Keep the day easy to manage.

Separate sections guide the organiser through the event, the people helping and the attendees taking part.

01

Create the event

Give it a name and a start and end time. The event follows those dates, with options to extend it or end it early.

02

Choose the responsible adults

Select registered organisation members. Add parents or other helpers through a short-lived joining QR or an email invitation.

03

Choose the finder contacts

Select who should appear on a scanned band. Add a friendly public name and phone number, with sharing permission for helpers.

04

Add attendees and allocate codes

Paste a list or upload a CSV. Use names or recognisable labels in your own format; attendees do not need accounts.

Helpful checks before a code is shared

The readiness checklist shows missing contact names, phone numbers, selections or permissions, along with event timing and code assignment. Direct links take the organiser to the details that need attention.



Choose what your group needs.

Individual + disposable

Different codes on single-use bands. Contact finding and individual attendance.

Shared + disposable

One code printed for everyone. Contact finding only; no individual attendance.

Individual + reusable

Different codes on durable bands. Collect and reassign for another outing.

Shared + reusable

Durable bands with the same code. Reuse together for one event at a time.

Your codes. Your choice of printing.

Print cards or tags yourself, or use your chosen band supplier. Disposable describes the band, not the code. Reprint existing codes or reuse durable bands; each individual code has only one attendee assignment at a time.

Ready for the next scan. Search by name if a band cannot scan.

One check, shared visibility. Helpers select their coach and scan each person aboard. The organiser sees all coaches and anyone still outstanding, with regular updates while connected. Illustrations use fictional attendees.

Repeat scans do not count twice. Moving someone between coaches needs confirmation and is recorded. Create a new check for the return journey to preserve the outward record.

The event ends. The contact page closes.

Contacts stop being shared and codes return to stock; only permanent retirement prevents reuse. Old attendance stays with its event. Records are kept for six months, then deleted unless the organisation chooses an archive.
